Chamber Promotes Community at State of the City Luncheon

Mayor delivers State of the City Address



Dr. Thomas E. Holden was elected to his fourth term as Mayor in November, 2010. He also served our city as a councilmember from 1992 to 2002.

The Oxnard Chamber's annual State of the City luncheon is slated for March 25 with Mayor Holden to keynote. Mayor Holden will certainly have an array of issues to cover this year. The most recent developments regarding the state budget could probably fill the entire program. However, since he has undoubtedly mastered multi-tasking, the address will likely include quite a range of issues facing our community.

This is the first address since the election of two new city council members, which makes this address different from recent years. Timing and different perspectives all play a part in the city's function-

ality. From planning to budgeting, a number of updates and changes will be discussed.

How will Governor Brown's proposed changes to redevelopment agencies impact the plans to breathe new life into the downtown area? What other projects might be derailed by the dismantling of redevelopment agencies statewide? Will the draft 2030 General Plan be adopted by the city council soon? How is the new city staff spending limit working out? What progress has the city made on the Intelligent Traffic System? Is the recycled water pipeline project near completion (a question many Ventura Road travelers will want to know the answer to)? What is the status of our parks and recreation projects?

Chamber urges Council to adopt City's 2030 General Plan

If business moved at the same pace as government does, we would all be out of business. A process that began in 2002 is still being debated nine years later. In somewhat defense of the city of Oxnard, it is a monumental undertaking to comply with state law and file a General Plan every 10 years. The proposed 2030 General Plan (GP) for Oxnard contains something for everyone to hate (sounds like California's proposed budget). However, the voluminous document has been drafted, reviewed, redrafted, re-presented, redrafted again, and the process goes on and on.

The city of Oxnard has undoubtedly invested millions of dollars in the GP and its accompanying Environmental Impact Report. Last year, the city council was presented with the latest version for approval or direction. City staff received the latter and was charged with holding a series of workshops on various elements of the GP such as Ormond Beach and the Coastal Zone; the Housing Element and Economic Development; Public Facilities and

Services and Schools; and the Del Norte Expansion Area/Jones Ranch Specific Plan. The workshops consumed the last four to five months of 2010.

Last month the city council received a report from the Planning Department on the status of the 2030 GP – a wise move since there are now two council members who were not part of the development process in the past few years. However, there was another detour for one important part of the GP. The third revision of the Housing Element was presented to the Planning Commission in February. The number of housing units the city is required (by state law) to provide changes from time to time, and the plan to provide those units must be incorporated in the GP. There are also five new members of the Planning Commission, so it may take more than one or two meetings to them to approve the Housing Element before sending it on to the city council.

The Sacramento Shuffle

Advocates of businesses, Nancy Lindholm, Brendan Huffman (Executive Director of the Chambers of Commerce Alliance of Ventura & Santa Barbara County) and I went to Sacramento February 15 to talk with

legislators in our districts. We were there to introduce ourselves, hear about the bills they were introducing, and to gather information for future visits. Our goal was to remain on top of issues that affect California businesses.

Our first stop was at the California Chamber of Commerce. We immediately encountered the general mindset in Sacramento: the number one priority is the BUDGET... and there is NO MONEY. Sadly, job creation holds second place, at best.

We went from one legislative office to the next and it appeared that everyone was scrambling to compile their legislative bill packages. The emphasis was on producing bills that either increased revenue or eliminated spending. It goes

without saying that any bill that required funding, must have a viable revenue stream.

- Assemblywoman Julia Brownley believes that for a bill to pass it must be transparent, accountable, efficient, and effective. Her focus, as it has been for years, is education – particularly public education.
- Marc Burgat, Vice President of Government Relations, California Chamber of Commerce discussed the possible measures for the June ballot and stressed that voters must be able to trust and verify what is on the ballot before they vote for it. The California Chamber is withholding positions on proposed elements of the budget until all proposals are on the table.
- Sean Hoffman, Legislative Director from Assemblyman Cameron Smyth's office relayed that they are focused on efficiencies in local government and educational spending, and job creation.
- At the California League of Cities we attended a strategic briefing to "Stop the state's redevelopment proposal" one hour before the Joint Hearing on Senate Transportation and Housing and Assembly Housing Community Development. There were over 100

senior citizens in the Capitol to give testimony at this hearing.

- Mark Timmerman, Chief of Staff from Assemblyman Jeff Gorell's office discussed the consolidation of taxing agencies, budget prioritization with a planned 20% cut from each office and CEQA reform (California Environmental Quality Act).
- We also visited with Legislative Director Kerry Yoshida from Senator Tony Strickland's office, Legislative Director Erin Baum from Assemblyman Das Williams' office, and Environmental Policy Director Adrienne Alvord of Senator Fran Pavley's office where we continued the discussions on reforms and budget.

The same day we were legislative hopping, Governor Brown announced a hiring freeze that, along with a cutback of state-issued cell phones, would save an estimated \$363 million in the fiscal year.

The business strategy in Sacramento appears to be sound - increase revenue and reduce spending. Can they do it? We will be back next month to see how we can support or inform our legislators in their quest to make "California a national leader in job creation" once again.

Chamber opposes unionization posting requirement

Last month we ran a front-page article in the Business Voice about a proposed new employee notification rule from the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB). We weren't the only ones getting the message out to businesses. The US Chamber of Commerce is all over this issue, the

California Chamber of Commerce is sounding the alarm to their members, Washington DC media outlets are on it, and business publications are reporting on it. So what's the brouhaha all about?

Business leaders and industry asso-

ciations are incensed that the NLRB is proposing to make it mandatory for employers to post a notice informing employees of their right to unionize. You might ask, "What's wrong with that?" For one thing, it is beyond the scope of the NLRB, which is only charged with preventing, investigating, and remedying unfair labor practices as defined in the National Labor Relation Act.

In February, Businessweek reported that in the 1950s about one-third of American workers carried a union card. Today barely 12 percent do. In the private sector the rate is 6.9 percent and falling. The U.S. labor movement for years sought to arrest the decline with legislation allowing workers to organize once a majority of employees signed a card authorizing a union. Companies successfully fought so-called card-check measures, arguing that bypassing secret ballots

was un-American.

(Note: The Oxnard Chamber of Commerce led a delegation of more than 20 business representatives to Washington DC in 2009 in opposition of card-check legislation, which ultimately failed to pass out of the legislature.) Businessweek continues to say that these days unions are pinning their hopes on the NLRB, one of Washington's more obscure federal agencies – and among the most politicized.

The Oxnard Chamber of Commerce has filed its objection on the proposed ruling and joined US and California coalitions opposed to the posting requirement. We will continue to keep our membership informed on this issue. If deemed necessary, we may organize another delegation to travel to Washington to fight for the rights of business.

Chamber encourages members to join Sacramento delegation

Representatives of the Oxnard Chamber of Commerce will be taking their issues and concerns to Sacramento in conjunction with the California Chamber's annual Business Summit on June 1. The event provides opportunities to hear some high level speakers and have meetings with our state representatives.

The trip agenda and meetings are coordinated by the Chambers of Commerce Alliance of Ventura & Santa Barbara Counties. Representing ten chambers of commerce in the region, the Alliance delegation will have quite a list of issues to address. As legislative bills are vetted through state committees, the priority items to focus on will be established.

In addition to the CalChamber program and the Capitol visits, the delegation will also attend the annual Sacramento Host Committee Breakfast with Governor Brown as the keynote speaker.

All Chamber members are invited to join the delegation. Save the date – June 1-2. Details will be forthcoming.

We all would like to have a pristine coastline. However, there have been no proposals to replace those sources of energy. Reliable cost-effective energy is critical to business. Many companies have located in Oxnard and provided jobs for our residents based on our energy infrastructure.

development in south Oxnard along Hueneme Road. Plans for both have been in the works for more than eight years. The city's inventory of land for future job creation is of great concern and the state-mandated housing supply needs to be addressed.

The Chamber understands that the 2030 General Plan is just that – a plan. However, once concepts are incorporated they are challenging to overturn. As the proposed 2030 GP moves towards adoption by the city council, the Chamber may be calling upon business leaders to voice their concerns at council meetings.

The Chamber is also concerned with the pressure on city council members to limit future residential and light industrial

State Targets Redevelopment Agencies for Elimination

Last year, California paid out a total of \$22 billion in unemployment benefits as the jobless rate hovers at nearly 13 percent. This year, California's budget deficit is approximately \$25 billion with federal loans to pay back soon and inevitable more cuts to services.

Among the many cuts Governor Jerry Brown has proposed is to eliminate California's \$1.9 billion program for community redevelopment agencies. Nearly 400 redevelopment agencies are now operating, and, naturally, some are performing better than others. In Ventura and Santa Barbara Counties, redevelopment projects currently account for 7126 jobs—those are a lot of jobs that could suddenly be eliminated.

The Chambers of Commerce Alliance is working with our cities to protect our redevelopment agencies from total elimination, but so far none of our legislators are voicing opposition.

Clearly, some redevelopment agencies are going to operate in the red until projects are completed and bring in revenue. Some of our region's redevelopment projects where revenues have exceeded expenditures in the 2008-09 FY are:

- Santa Barbara's central city project: \$23,108,690 (revenues); \$20,480,996 (expenditures).
- Camarillo's corridor project: \$7,728,193; \$6,731,542.
- Oxnard's Central City Revitalization Project Area: \$5,456,990; \$3,521,724.
- Port Hueneme's Central Community Project Area: \$5,842,817; \$4,778,730.
- Santa Paula's Redevelopment Project: \$3,793,551; \$3,236,782.

- Thousand Oaks Boulevard Project Area: \$21,411,058; \$13,860,882.

Keep in mind that even those agencies spending more than they're taking in right now are participating in our economic recovery. Construction creates jobs and when the construction work is completed, employers tend to move in and generate new tax revenues.

Of course, the budget battle over redevelopment monies has little to do with how effective they are and much more to do with the state prioritizing its own budget deficit. The Alliance recognizes that dynamic of California's fiscal operations.

That being said, can't the state set some criteria for measuring the performance of local redevelopment agencies and base state allocations on that instead of treating all 400

redevelopment agencies as bad apples? State Controller John Chiang is now auditing 18 of California's larger redevelopment agencies, which surely will reveal what we already know—some redevelopment agencies produce more than others.

Regardless, the Alliance urges lawmakers to look closer at the redevelopment agencies in their districts before they throw the baby out with the bathwater. If some redevelopment agencies are meeting expectations, why eliminate them?
